Thinking Safety for August

RIDE DEFENSIVELY...

We are now well into the 2011 riding season and we hope that you are all enjoying it as much as we are. Wing Fling was a good event even though the weather was a little over the top. We still had great fun and enjoyed watching everyone participate in the games and activities. We also had a great time at **Wing Ding** and hope you brought back some **KNOWLEDGE** you can share with your **FRIENDS** while having **FUN** and using **SAFETY** when out riding. If you have not been able to take an ERC, TRC, or other riding course this season, please remember that...

***Nearly two-thirds of all motorcycle accidents are caused by a driver violating a rider's right-of-way.** Usually this is because the motorcyclist was not seen. To avoid this, **YOU MUST RIDE AS IF NO ONE ELSE ON THE ROAD CAN SEE YOU!**

Helpful tips to remember:

- *Slow down at intersections and ride through carefully.
- *Watch for turning vehicles.
- *Stay out of driver's blind spots.
- *Signal well in advance of any change in your driving pattern.
- ***Don't assume a driver sees you**, even if eye contact is made.
- *Use your horn when necessary or if you aren't sure a driver can see where you are.
- ***RIDE PROUD... DRESS LOUD**

Be careful when you approach another vehicle. It's hard for drivers in oncoming vehicles to accurately judge how fast your motorcycle is moving. That's why it's up to you to make sure you can react safely if another driver suddenly turns or pulls out in front of you. Also, make sure you have plenty of space between you and the vehicles in front of you.

And speaking of space, make some space on your 2011 calendar for this year's **District Rally** in Litchfield, IL **August 5 - 6**. Ride on down and have some **FUN** with your fellow **WINGERS**. This one promises to be one of the best at a new location with lots of shopping available. Let your fellow riders know just how much **PARTICIPATION = FUN**.

Remember, if you don't look out for yourself on the road,
...no one else will.

***Stay Awake, Stay Alert, Stay Alive...**

Rider fatigue can be deadly. It can happen any time, but it is most frequent on long rides after dark. Along with feeling drowsy, other signs of rider fatigue are back tension, burning eyes, shallow breathing, inattentiveness, and erratic riding.

One aggravating factor is alcohol. Alcohol is a depressant, and even one drink can be enough to produce a drowsy rider. Other culprits include today's Gold Wings themselves. They are smoother, quieter, and more comfortable. Cruise control is a wonderful feature but can contribute to falling asleep while riding.

The National Safety Council recommends the following tips for staying awake – and staying safe – when you are riding.

- Get enough rest. This may seem obvious, but if you have not had a restful sleep, you are inviting rider fatigue.
- If possible, do not ride alone.
- Try to avoid riding long distances at night.
- Use the audio on your radio to help keep you awake and alert.
- Use the cruise control sparingly. *(continued on page 4)*

(Thinking Safety continued)

- Watch ergonomic factors. Ride with your head and eyes up along with a good riding posture.
- In the daytime wear sunglasses to fight glare and help prevent eye fatigue.
- Take frequent breaks.
- **Avoid overeating; have light meals and snacks. Don't drink any alcohol.**
- If you still find yourself getting drowsy riding, pull over into a rest stop or just stop for the night at the next motel.
- **GOLDEN RULE: Listen to your Co-Rider** who may well know what's going on better than you. Co-Rider, watch for the warning signs for fatigue and tell the rider YOU need a break. Once stopped, visit about your observations.

Remember, safe riding is important and demands your full attention

...stay awake, stay alert, and stay alive.

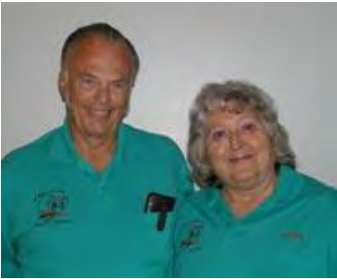

From Moline area: Take Route 150 South through Orion to Route 81 East (Or I-74 South to Exit 24, which is Route 81). Travel East to Andover (then see directions from Andover).

From Andover: Turn South at Casey's on County Highway 9; Continue South for 1+ miles to first intersection to left (North 850 Avenue). Turn left (East) and continue for 1.5 miles to a stop sign. Continue through the stop sign for another 1/3 mile to the bottom of the hill. We are on the left side of the road—number on the mail box 8952.

NOTE: This road is hilly and often used by deer. **Ride with Caution!!**



We fed a total of 29 people, I think everyone ate their fill because there was some left over.

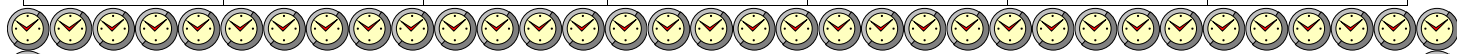

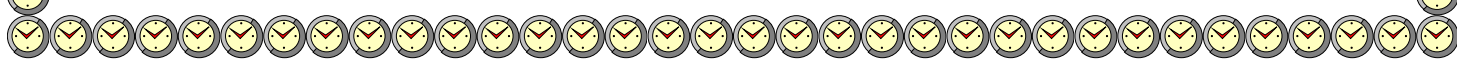

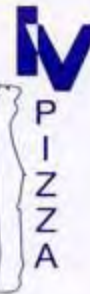
