## Rider Education

### Thinking Safety for June

It seems the hot weather for the summer is here early and may stay. Let's look at information on safety for hot weather riding. Dehydration can sneak up on a person and slow our thought processes thus putting us in jeopardy. You can prevent heat-related illnesses by being prepared. The important thing is to stay well-hydrated, to make sure that your body can get rid of extra heat, and to be sensible about riding in hot, humid weather.

Sweating is your body's main system for getting rid of extra heat. When you sweat, and the water evaporates from your skin, the heat that evaporates the sweat comes mainly from your skin. As long as blood is flowing properly to your skin, extra heat from the core of your body is "pumped" to the skin and removed by sweat evaporation. If you do not sweat enough, your body cannot get rid of extra heat fast enough to cool your core temperature. Dehydration will make it harder for you to cool off in two ways: if you are dehydrated you won't sweat as much, and your body will try to keep blood away from the skin to keep your blood pressure at the right level in the core of your body. If the air is humid, it's harder for your sweat to evaporate—this means that your body cannot get rid of extra heat as well when it's muggy as it can when it's relatively dry.

The best fluid to drink when you are sweating is water. Although there is little salt in your sweat, you don't really lose that much salt with your sweat, except in special circumstances; taking salt tablets may raise your body's sodium level to hazardous levels. "Sports Drinks" such as Gatorade will also work, but water is usually easier to obtain.

When riding in hot weather remember the following guidelines:

- Drink plenty of water to re-hydrate your body.
- Wear light-weight, light colored clothing.
- Long-sleeved white shirts will keep you cooler than short-sleeved shirts.
- Use a cool-collar, wet towel, or cool-vest to help stay cool. As the water evaporates from these items, the evaporation process carries heat from the surface of your body.
- Carry a spray bottle of water with you. At each stop, just before remounting your bike, spray your body to increase evaporation and cooling as you ride. (Carolyn loves the chance to spray me even while we are riding down the road.)
- On extremely hot days, stop more often to drink, re-wet collars, and spray yourself (or each other).
- Dehydration can affect your thinking processes and reaction times, putting you and your co-rider in danger.

**Think you are having a bad day??** A woman came home to find her husband in the kitchen, shaking frantically with what looked like a wire running from his waist towards the electric kettle. Intending to jolt him away from the deadly current, she whacked him with a handy plank of wood by the back door, breaking his arm in two places. Until that moment he had been happily listening to his Walkman.

- Alarms – What an octopus is.

### Road Characteristics

What are road characteristics and why are they important?

- One can be a **change of color** of the roadway, which could mean road repair, a new road surface or something on the road such as water, oil or dirt.
- Are the lines **paint** or the new **white rubber**? These can be very slick.
- What are **tar snakes**? This is the tar that is put on cracks in the roadway to seal the cracks. Some of it is applied too thick or too wide and is not a good place for a motorcycle to travel on them. (continued on page 4)

- Another characteristic about the road is the types of surfaces from old road pavements especially blacktopped roads with **ruts**. Heavy trucks run the same path all the time which causes the pavement to be lower where they drive and higher in the center of the lane. If you pull a trailer you know what I am referring to.
- You need to think about the **road camber** or lean. It can affect maneuvering from side to side or may tend to pull your vehicle toward the edge of the road.
- Keep a lookout for any strange or **uncommon characteristics** you may find (grooves, etc).
- Any change can lead to a **change in traction** of your tires, which could mean a skid or loss of control.

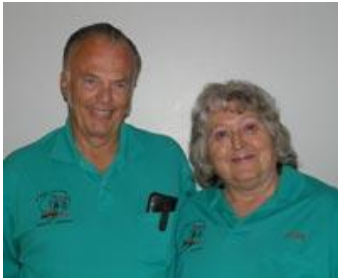

We have released the **Officers Certification Program** as an online version, which we will be offering as a choice for the member to take.

Although we are offering it online, when available we recommend for Members to attend a live presentation. The online version has no interaction with others whereby a lot of good information becomes available to them. It is approximately 7-8 hours in length for all 15 modules, including the Knowledge exercises.

A member wishing to participate in the online Officers Certification Program must contact their respective District Trainer or Region Trainer to receive the sign-on information and also a study guide to assist you while taking the online version of OCP.

Once you sign on go to the section saying Modules, click on it and get started with the program. You may start and stop whenever you feel comfortable. When you resume the program it will automatically start where you left off. At the end of each module you will be instructed to "Go to the Quiz". You must answer the questions before proceeding to the next module.

If you have a Dial-Up ISP then you may opt for doing it on a DVD. The same rules apply as for the on-line version.

You will have 30 days from the time you start till the time you must have it completed, for whichever version you decide to go with.


